The Social Planning Council of Cambridge and North Dumfries Launches Three New Reports

The Youth Population in Cambridge and North Dumfries

Our youth represent the future of our community, and yet compared to adults youth face some unique challenges. Based on Census statistics together with local agency data, this fact sheet focuses on the youth population in Cambridge and North Dumfries and includes information on educational attainment, labour force participation, unemployment rates, suicidal behaviour, homelessness and more. This is the fourth fact sheet in a recent series. Previous fact sheets have focused on Seniors in Cambridge and North Dumfries, Recent Immigrants to Cambridge, and Disability in Cambridge and North Dumfries. Understanding the Current Service Landscape within the Immigrant Settlement Sector

Given the importance of immigration to Waterloo Region and the extent of services provided by immigrant serving agencies the Social Planning Council of Cambridge and North Dumfries and United Way of Kitchener Waterloo and Area wanted to solicit the views of program managers and those who support them on the current environment in which they operate. The information gathered is summarized in the report “*Understanding the Current Service Landscape within the Immigrant Settlement Sector*” which was published in November 2011.

North Dumfries Needs and Capacity Assessment – Community Survey Results

Every 5 years the Woolwich Community Health Centre conducts a community needs and capacity assessment. These assessments focus on Woolwich, Wellesley and Wilmot Townships and provide a description of these communities through data from various sources. The intent has been to identify common themes of significance for the health of residents and help inform program planning and decision-making. Up to now there have been no similar studies in North Dumfries. The report “*North Dumfries Needs and Capacity Assessment – Community Survey Results*”, a joint undertaking between the Social Planning Council of Cambridge and North Dumfries and the North Dumfries Community Health Centre, was published in December 2011. The intent of this report is to begin to fill the gaps in knowledge about access to health care and other services in North Dumfries, to understand what is important to Township residents, and to learn what services and programs residents would like to see in their community.
